## AUTOMOBILE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

CANADIAN OUTPUT OF AUTOMOBILES CONTINUED UPWARD TREND IN MARCH, 1926

Production of automobiles in March, 1926, totalled 22,374 in number including 9,035 closed and 7,628 open cars, 2,901 chassis, 2,791 trucks and 19 taxicabs or buses. This output was 41 per cent greater than the 15,841 units reported for March of a year ago and marked an increase of 19 per cent over the 18,832 units produced in February which number in turn was 22 per cent higher than the total for January.

Exclusive of chassis and taxicabs and buses the production of passenger cars during the month under review numbered 16,663 as compared with 12,961 in the previous month and 11,916 in March of last year. Closed car models advanced to 9,035 in number or almost double the outputs of 5,433 in February, 1926, and 4,584 in March, 1925. Production of open cars was also slightly higher, the actual number being 7,628 in March and 7,528 in February.

Trucks numbered 2,791 made up as follows: under 1 ton capacity 444; one ton, 2,241; over 1 ton and under 5 tons, 106. In February of this year 2,374 were produced; 2,354 were made in March, 1925.

Cumulative production for the first quarter of the year showed an advance of 45 per cent over the total for the same period in 1925. The total output for the year to date included 40,267 passenger cars, 7,641 trucks, 8,737 chassis and 46 taxicabs or buses, making a total of 56,691 as compared with 39,029 in the same three months of a year ago.

As compared with February imports of motor cars showed an increase in March of 1,254 units and exports increased by 2,473 units; the actual figures showed: imports, 2,170; exports, 10,911. For the first quarter of the year imports totalled 3,777 in number which with the production of 56,691 made a total available supply of 60,468 cars but as 24,508 were exported, the apparent consumption in Canada for the year to date stood at 35,960. During the same period of 1925 there was an apparent supply of 23,381 when the production totalled 39,029, imports 2,285 and exports 17,933.

In the United States, March furnished the second highest monthly output of automobiles ever recorded. Total production was estimated at 447,185 cars; this figure was higher than for any preceding March and second only to the record of 452,486 made last October. March marked a gain of almost 20 per cent over February's total of 375,332.
