

## AUTOMOBILE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

## JANUARY 1930

According to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa, the production of motor vehicles in Canada during January numbered 10,388 units. This output was less than half the 21,501 cars made in January, 1929, but exceeded by 23 per cent the 8,463 cars reported for January, 1928. After being adjusted for seasonal variation, the figures for January, 1930, were still 40 per cent below the normal, as indicated by the long term trend observed during the five-year period 1925-1929.

Compared with the figures for the next preceding month, data for January showed an increase in the output of all types of cars with the exception of open passenger cars which declined to 594 from 661. Open model passenger cars advanced to 6,255 from 3,115, trucks to 365 from 136, chassis to 3,148 from 1,583 and 26 taxicabe or buses were made while none of these were reported for December.

Customs' records for January showed that 1,290 cars were imported into Canada and that 2,997 care were exported during the same period. Corresponding figures for December indicated an import of 847 cars and an export of 4,910 cars.

Of the total output during January, 6,267 cars were made for sale in Canada and 4,121 cars were intended for export. The apparent consumption of automobiles in Canada during the month, determined by adding the 6,267 cars made for sale in Canada to the 1,290 cars imported, amounted to 7,557 cars. Comparative figures showing the number of cars made available for consumption in Canada during the previous month totalled 3,596 cars and in January last year, 13,285 cars.
