

AUTOMOBILE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

DECEMBER 1930

Production of automobiles in Canada during 1930 at 154,192 cars was 41.3 per cent under the record of 262,625 cars in the previous year. The Bureau's index number which is based on 100 for the five-year period 1919 to 1924, and adjusted for normal production on the long term trend 1919 to 1927 inclusive, started at 60 in January, or 40 per cent below the normal, after which it gradually climbed until the peak of 104.7 was registered in May; the index then dropped steadily to the year's low of 25 in October and recovered slightly to around 30 during November and December.

The greatest loss from the previous year was in the number of exported cars, this trade dropping to 45,361 cars from 102,382 cars in 1929. Imports also declined to 23,233 cars from 44,724 cars. A calculation of the number of cars made available for use in Canada during 1930, made by deducting the exports from the sum of the production and the imports, shows a total of 132,064 cars as compared with a consumption of 204,967 cars in 1929.

Estimating the population of Canada at 9,934,500 persons in 1930, and taking the number of cars made at 154,192, it follows that in the year under review Canadian automobile manufacturers made one new car for every 64 persons in the Dominion. In 1929 production averaged one new car to 37 persons, in 1928 one car to 40 persons, in 1927 one car to 53 persons, in 1926 one car to 46 persons, and in 1925 the ratio was one car to 57 persons.

Compared with data for the preceding year, production figures for 1930 showed an increase in truck chassis to 22,027 from 9,025; the total chassis including passenger rose to 32,091 from 23,611. Losses were reported for all other lines including open passenger cars to 19,990 from 34,744, closed model passenger cars to 95,822 from 153,778, trucks to 6,214 from 50,293, and only 135 taxicabs or buses were made in 1930 as against 199 of this type in 1929.
