# AUTOMOBILE STATISTICS FOR CANADA 

APRIL 1930
Production of automobiles in Canada during April at 24.257 cars was well under the 41,901 cars produced in April of a year ago, the record month of the industry, but compares favourably with the totals of 24,211 cars in April, 1928 , and 24,611 cars in April, 1927. The Bureau's monthly index number on motor car production, which makes due allowances for seasonal tendencies and is based on the long torm trend, 1919 to 1927 inclusive, shows that the output was 40 per cent below normal in January of this year, was still 22 per cent under normal in February and 7.4 per cent below in March, but in April it was 2.5 per cent above the normal for that month.

When compared with data for last month, the figures for April show an increase in the output of open and closed paseonger cars and a declino in the number of irucks, chassis, taxicabs and buses. The number of open passenger cars rose to 2,517 from 2,420; closed model passenger cars to 17,409 from 13,540 ; trucks declinge to 777 from 1,011 ; chassis dropped to 3,547 from 3,749 , and the number of taxicabs and buses was lower at 7 as against 10 in March.

Customs' records show that the number of cars imported into Canada during April was 3,432 as compared with 3,805 in March; exporis also declined to 3,321 from 6,360 in the preceding month.

Of the total cars produced in Caneda during April, 2,964 were intended for export and the balance of 21,293 cars were made for sal. in the Canadian market. The apparent consumption of automobile in Canada during the month, as determined by adding the 21,293 cars made for sale in Canada to the 3,432 cars imported. amounted to 24,725 cars. For the year to date the apparent consumption, thus computed, was 64,612 cars.
