

## AUTOMOBILE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

SEPTEMBER 1930

Production of automobiles in Canada during September amounted to 7,957 cars, the lowest number reported for any month of the year to date. This output was 19 per cent under the total of 9,792 for the previous month and 42 per cent less than the 13,817 cars made in September of a year ago. The Bureau's monthly index number on motor car production, which makes due allowances for seasonal tendencies and is based on the long term trend 1919 to 1927 inclusive, shows that the September rate of output in the Canadian automobile industry was 58.9 per cent below the normal for that month.

Data for September, when compared with the statistics for the previous month, showed smaller outputs for all types of cars with the exception of trucks which advanced slightly to 509 units from 307 in August. Open passenger cars declined to 1,289 from 1,663, closed model passenger cars dropped to 3.570 from 4,736, chassis receded to 2,583 from 3,036, and the number of taxicabs or buses was lower at 6 as against 20 of this type in the previous month.

For the first nine months of this year the cumulative production of cars totalled 138,622, a decline of 41 per cent from the nine-month record established in the previous year at 233,853 cars which in turn was 13 per cent greater in number than the total of 202,652 cars made during the first three-quarters of 1928.

This year's output to date was proportioned as follows: closed model passenger cars, 64 per cent; chassis, 20 per cent; open passenger cars, 12 per cent, and trucks, almost 4 per cent. The number of taxicabs and buses was under 1 per cent.

A calculation of the number of cars made available for distribution in Canada during September, made by adding the imports of 1,458 to the 3,910 cars made for sale in Canada, gives a total of 5,368 cars. For the year to date the number of cars made available for Canadian consumption, thus computed, totalled 123,406 cars.
