

ANNUAL INDUSTRY REPORT

IRON AND STEEL AND THEIR PRODUCTS GROUP

THE FARM IMPLEMENTS AND MACHINERY INDUSTRY, 1939

Production by establishments in the farm implements and machinery industry was 25 per cent lower in value in 1939 than in 1938 and 16 per cent lower than in 1937. Actual values (at factory prices) for these years were as follows: \$16,035,223 in 1939, \$21,299,185 in 1938 and \$18,961,394 in 1937.

Imports of agricultural machinery increased to \$20,917,487 in 1939 from \$20,319,626 in 1938, a gain of 3 per cent. The value of farm tractors and parts was slightly greater at \$15,002,601 compared with \$14,813,014, and other farm equipment advanced to \$5,914,886 from \$5,500,612.

Exports and re-exports of farm implements were appraised at \$7,027,860 in 1939, a decline of about 11 per cent from the \$7,871,931 reported for 1938.

Thirty-six factories were included in the farm implements industry in 1939, there being 25 works in Ontario, 5 in Quebec, 4 in Manitoba and 1 each in Alberta and Prince Edward Island. The works in Ontario accounted for 95 per cent of the total output.

The industry employed an average of 5,306 workers during the year; the 1,047 salaried employees were paid \$1,644,601 and the 4,259 wage-earners, \$4,380,119. The total of \$6,024,720 for salaries and wages was 20 per cent less than the amount distributed to the 6,458 employees in 1938.

Capital employed in manufacturing operations at the end of the year amounted to \$58,067,218, including \$15,226,752 as the value of land, buildings and factory equipment, \$17,990,669 as the inventory value of materials and products on hand and \$24,849,817 as operating capital. The value of buildings, etc. was \$1.8 millions lower than in 1938, operating capital was down \$1 million, and inventories declined \$3 millions.

Sales in Canada of new farm implements and equipment were valued at \$33,927,654 (at wholesale prices to dealers) in 1939 or about 6.3 per cent less than in 1938 when the corresponding value was \$36,313,832. Sales of the various implements are given in detail in a separate report which has been issued by the Bureau.


