

THE AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS INDUSTRY

1954

Factory shipments reported by establishments in the Agricultural Implements Industry were valued at \$119,006,228 in 1954, a decline of 30.5 per cent from the \$171,269,525 reported in the previous year. The output of farm equipment in this industry amounted to \$109,098,976 in 1954, \$156,287,039 in 1953 and \$188,183,920 in 1952; the remainder of the output of the industry in each year was made up of miscellaneous types of machinery and parts. In other industries there was a small production of farm machinery amounting to \$3,990,000 in 1954, \$3,564,000 in 1953 and \$6,504,000 in 1952.

Seventy-six factories were included in the Agricultural Implements Industry in 1954, there being 29 plants in Ontario, 17 in Manitoba, 9 in Saskatchewan, 9 in Alberta, 7 in Quebec, 4 in British Columbia and 1 in Prince Edward Island. The works in Ontario accounted for 92.4 per cent of the total output.

The industry employed a total of 11,805 workers during the year, the 2,856 salaried employees being paid \$11,690,306 and the 8,949 wage-earners, \$28,534,665. The total of \$40,224,971 for salaries and wages was 20 per cent less than the amount distributed to the 14,161 employees in 1953.

Note: Figures for value added by manufacture shown in Table 1 prior to 1952 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1952, the gross value of production was replaced by value of factory shipments, f.o.b. plant. As no information on inventory change is available for 1952 and 1953, value added figures for these years were obtained by subtracting from the value of shipments the cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses was collected as part of the annual Census of Industry and information thus made available was taken into account in calculating the value added figure for 1954.
