

THE AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS INDUSTRY 1955

The Agricultural Implements Industry covers those firms which produced agricultural implements as their main product. However, some firms, which are classified to other industrial groups, produced agricultural implements as a minor part of their production. Tables 5 to 16 attempt to gather together production data from all industrial groups for the specified commodities.

Factory shipments reported by establishments which have been classified to the Agricultural Implements Industry were valued at \$113,923,309 in 1955, a decline of 4 per cent from the \$119,006,228 reported in the previous year. The output of farm equipment in this industry amounted to \$106,732,497 in 1955, \$109,098,976 in 1954 and \$156,287,039 in 1953; the remainder of the output of the industry in each year was made up of miscellaneous types of machinery and parts. In other industries there was a small production of farm machinery amounting to \$2,969,000 in 1955, \$3,990,000 in 1954 and \$3,564,000 in 1953.

Seventy-seven factories were included in the Agricultural Implements Industry in 1955, there being 31 in Ontario, 16 in Manitoba, 8 in Saskatchewan, 10 in Alberta, 8 in Quebec and 4 in British Columbia. The works in Ontario accounted for 92.4 per cent of the total output.

The industry employed a total of 11,753 workers during the year, the 2,801 salaried employees being paid \$11,244,548 and the 8,952 wage-earners, \$30,684,492. The total of \$41,929,040 for salaries and wages was 4 per cent greater than the amount distributed to the 11,805 employees in 1954.

Note: Figures for value added by manufacture, shown in Table 1, prior to 1952 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1952 the gross value of production was replaced by value of factory shipments, f.o.b. plant. As no information on inventory change is available for 1952 and 1953, value added figures for these years were obtained by subtracting from the value of shipments the cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1954 and 1955 information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses was collected as part of the annual Census of Industry and information thus made available was taken into account in calculating the value added figures for 1954 and 1955.


