THE BICYCLE MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931.

Bicycle concerns employed a capital of \$2,245,458 of which \$1,078,137 represented the value placed on plants and factory equipment. An average of 334 workers were employed throughout the year and \$322,040 was expended for salaries and wages. Fuel and power cost \$22,605 and \$200,791 was paid for manufacturing materials.
