## THE BICYCIE MANUY CRURITYG INDUSTRY IN CANAD 1933.

Manufacturers of bicycles in Canada reported a total output valued at $\$ 712,624$ in 1933 as compared with $¢ 762,348$ for the sane concerns in 1932. Products included 18,215 bicycles worth $\{398,035$ at factory prices, tricycles and other children's vehicles and ice skates.

Bicycle concerns employed a capitai of $\$ 2,035,493$ of which $\} 1,100,980$ represented the value placed on plants and factory equipment. An average of 236 workers were employed throughout the year und $\langle 247,054$ was expendud for salaries and wages. Fuel and power cost $\{23,307$ and $\{276,816$ was paid for manufacturing materisis.
