THE BOAT BUILDING INDUSTRY

1957

This industry comprises establishments engaged wholly or chiefly in the manufacture of small vessels and pleasure craft, such as rowboats, canoes, sailboats, motor boats, etc. Factory shipments in 1957 were valued at \$12,885,931, an increase of 12.0 per cent over the 1956 total of \$11,507,160.

The 206 plants which reported in this group in 1957 were distributed across Canada as follows: 70 in Ontario, 58 in British Columbia, 35 in Quebec, 32 in Nova Scotia, 6 in Manitoba, 3 in New Brunswick and 1 in each of Prince Edward Island and Alberta.

The number of employees in 1957 was 1,757 and salaries and wages for the year amounted to

\$5,343,600. Materials used in manufacturing cost \$5,555,869 and fuel and electricity costs totalled \$193,817.

Note: Due to lack of inventory data, figures for value added by manufacture prior to 1954 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the total value of factory shipments. In 1954 and 1955 the "Value added" adjustment incorporated the increase or decrease to shipments values resulting from changes in the value of inventories over the period. For these two years, the adjustments that were made used only the change in finished product inventory owned by manufacturers. Beginning with 1956 the calculation of the "Value added" figure was further adjusted to take into account the "Goods in process" as well as the finished goods held at plant or plant warehouse.

(b) Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. These data were formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Boat Building Industry for the Year under review are shown in the above table.

(c) The opening inventory for 1957 does not necessarily agree with the closing inventory for 1956, because of the addition of new plants, the transfer of plants to other industries and plants going out of business, etc. However, the value added figures for the previous year have not been recalculated to allow for the changes mentioned above.


