THE AUTOMOBILE PARTS AND SUPPLIES INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1928.

Production from the automobile parts and supplies industry in Canada during 1928 was valued at \$17,007,157, according to a bulletin issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. This was the highest value reported for the industry since the record of \$22,000,640 was established in 1923. This year's output value was \$2 millions over the previous year, \$3 millions greater than in 1926 and \$6 millions more than in 1925.


Only concerns engaged chiefly in making auto parts or supplies have been included in this industry. Of the 77 plants thus classified, 45 were located in Ontario, 13 in British Columbia, 7 in Manitoba, 6 in Quebec, 5 in Alberta and 1 in Saskatchewan. Capital employed in these factories totalled \$16,343,956; employees numbered 3,509 and their carnings were \$4,756,409; purchased materials cost \$8,358,404, and the value added by manufacturing processes was \$8,648,753.

Articles made in this industry included bodies, springs, wheels, axles, radiators, bumpers, covers, lamps, lubricating systems, rims, tops and curtains, tools, shock absorbers, motor temperature indicators, tire gauges, etc.

The group reviewed in this bulletin includes only those plants in Canada which manufacture parts or accessories of iron or steel as their principal product. Many other establishments produce commodities for use in the automobile trade but their main business is of such a nature as to necessitate their classification in other industrial groups. Such plants as make tires, casings, batteries, upholstering, asbestos brake linings, etc., are not included in this survey but are covered by other reports issued by the Bureau.
