

For statistical purposes the industry titled Miscellaneous Vehicle Manufacturers (S.I.C. 329) in the revised Standard Industrial Classification covers the operations of establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing transportation equipment not elsewhere classified, such as animal-drawn vehicles including sleighs, as well as parts for any vehicles included.

During 1967 the total value of shipments of goods of own manufacture reported by firms classified to this industry increased by 40 per cent, gross output by 46 per cent and total value added on goods of own manufacture by 39 per cent. The cost of materials used represented 52 per cent of the value of production.





NOTES TO USERS

1. The detailed explanations of "Concepts and Definitions" omitted from this report may be consulted in any 1965 report in this series. If not available to the user, the relevant pages may be obtained free of charge from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division of the Bureau.
2. Tables on principal statistics classified by manufacturing value added, by total value added, and by type of organization, published in the 1966 report as Tables 3, 4 and 6, respectively, have been omitted from this report because of their limited interest. They are available, however, from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division. In the case of an extensive request involving a large number of industries, it may be necessary to levy a charge.
3. Users interested in obtaining the value of production (manufacturing activity) can do so by adding cost of materials and supplies used (manufacturing activity), cost of fuel and electricity, and value added (manufacturing activity). The resulting statistic is equivalent in concept to "gross output" shown in Table 7 of the 1966 report.
