

For statistical purposes the industry titled Commercial Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Equipment Manufacturers (S.I.C. 316) in the revised Standard Industrial Classification covers the operations of establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing electric and non-electric commercial refrigerating equipment such as display cases, counters and frozen food storage cabinets; and refrigeration units for installation in custom or built-in refrigeration facilities.

The industry also includes establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing self-contained air conditioning units (except window type) and air conditioning equipment for installation in custom and built-in air conditioning systems.

An analysis indicates that the total cost of materials used increased 0.7 per cent, the value of production decreased 2.0 per cent and the value of shipments increased by 1.3 per cent in 1967.

The ratio of cost of materials used to value of production was 55.4 per cent and the ratio of manufacturing wages to value of production was 15.4 per cent in 1967.

The value of shipments of refrigeration and air conditioning products represented 88 per cent of total shipments. Other products shipped were shelving, radiators, air filters and accessories, check out counters and supermarket fixtures.

It should be noted that Table 8 covers the shipments of the firms classified to this industry whereas Table 9 gives the total value of shipments of specific items of Canadian manufacture and includes shipments of these items reported by firms classified to other S.I.C. industries.

NOTES TO USERS

1. The detailed explanations of "Concepts and Definitions" omitted from this report may be consulted in any 1965 report in this series. If not available to the user, the relevant pages may be obtained free of charge from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division of the Bureau.
2. Tables on principal statistics classified by manufacturing value added, by total value added, and by type of organization, published in the 1966 report as Tables 3, 4 and 6, respectively, have been omitted from this report because of their limited interest. They are available, however, from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division. In the case of an extensive request involving a large number of industries, it may be necessary to levy a charge.
3. Users interested in obtaining the value of production (manufacturing activity) can do so by adding cost of materials and supplies used (manufacturing activity), cost of fuel and electricity, and value added (manufacturing activity). The resulting statistic is equivalent in concept to "gross output" shown in Table 7 of the 1966 report.
