

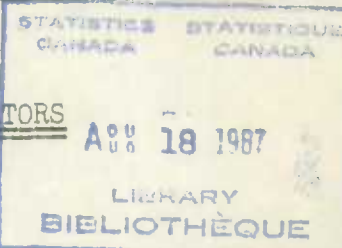

DOMESTIC WASHING MACHINES and ELECTRIC REFRIGERATORS

APRIL - 1949



(Note - This monthly report combines and replaces the two separate publications which formerly appeared under the titles of "Domestic Washing Machines" and "Domestic Type Electric Refrigerators").

Production of domestic type washing machines totalled 28,930 units in April, 1949 compared with 27,643 in April, 1948. For the first four months of this year the total was 124,462 units, an increase of 22 per cent over the number made in the corresponding period of 1948.

Output of household electric refrigerators during the current month amounted to 12,600 units, an increase of almost 20 per cent over the number made in April, 1948. The cumulative total for the first four months of this year was 55,130 units and for last year the comparative figure was 42,842 units.

7. The seventh part of the report is a list of conclusions. It includes a list of the conclusions drawn from the work, a list of the conclusions drawn from the literature, and a list of the conclusions drawn from the comparison of the results of the work with those obtained in previous years.
