DOMESTIC WASHING MACHINES AND ELECTRIC REFRIGERATORS

NOVEMBER - 1950

Production of domestic type washing machines totalled 28,082 units in November, 1950 compared with 32,583 in November, 1949. For the first eleven months of this year the total was 256,404 units, a decrease of 21 per cent from the number made in the corresponding period of 1949.

Output of household electric refrigerators during the current month amounted to 36,096 units, an increase of 112 per cent over the number made in November, 1949. The cumulative total for the first eleven months of this year was 315,273 units, and for last year the comparative figure was 163,781 units.
