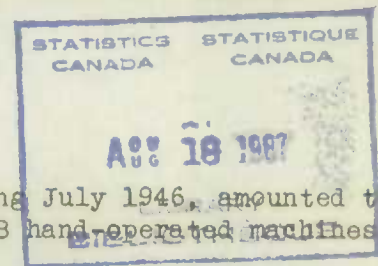

Production of domestic type washing machines during July 1946, amounted to 9,217 units, including 8,281 electric, 298 gasoline, and 638 hand operated machines.

Imports into Canada during July totalled 494 units and exports numbered 1,046 units.

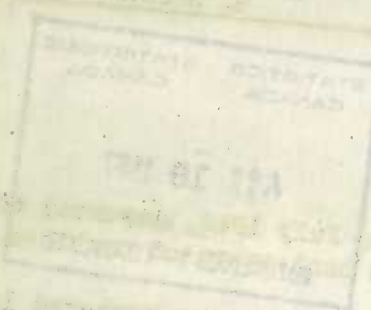
