DOMESTIC WASHING MACHINES


JULY, 1947

Production of domestic type washing machines during July, 1947 amounted to 14,425 units, including 12,920 electric, 961 gasoline, and 544 hand operated machines.

Imports into Canada during July totalled 5,874 units and exports 1,449 units.
