THE KADIO INDUSTRY IN CANADA ~ APKIL, MAY AND JUNE, 1962.
Sales of radio receiving sets in Canada during the second quarter of 1932 totsiled 11,210 machines valued at $\$ 575,802 \mathrm{f} .0 . \mathrm{b}$. factory while in the corresponding period of a year ago sales amounted to 28,092 machines worth $\$ 2,217,840$. When compared with data for April, Way and June 1931 the figures for the period under review show that the average factory price of a receiving set dropped 35 per cent to $\$ 51$ from $\$ 79$ but the lower rice per unit failed to maintain the volume of sales which was off 60 per cent in number to 11,210 from 28,092. Compared by provinces sales in the Naritimes dropped to 602 from 2,000, in Guebec to 2,953 from 7,907, in Ontario to 4,498 from 12, 355 , in the Prairie Provinces to 2,317 from 3,734 and in British Columia to 840 from 2,096. Or the total sales during April; May and June of this year 91 per cent were A. C . operated receiving sets, exclusive of combinations. A.C. combination phonograph and radio accounted for 5 per cent and the balance of 4 per cent was battery operated sets including those intended for use in motor cars, motor boats, etc, of the $\dot{A} . C$. receiving sets the machines with a list price of less than $\$ 65$ made up 19 per cent of the total sales, sets listed from $\$ 65$ to less than $\$ 100$ amounted to nearly 34 per cent, sets from \$100 to less than $\$ 175$ accounted for 30 per cent while the remaining 8 per cent were machines listed at \$175 and over.

Sales by provinces for the six months ending June $30,193 \%$, as compared with those for the first half of last year show that the Maritime Provinces, Quebec and Ontario took a smaller percentage of the total while sales in the Prairie Provinces and British Columbia were proportionately higher. In the Maritime Provinces the jercentage dropped to 6.0 from 6.1, in Quebec to 25.7 from 28.4 and in Ontario to 44.3 from 47.1 . In the Prairie Provinces the percentage rose to 16.2 from 11.1 and in British Columbia to 7.8 from 7.3.
