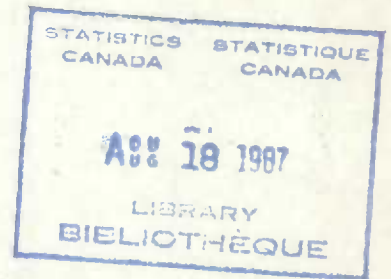

FACTORY SALES OF ELECTRIC STORAGE BATTERIES

SEPTEMBER, 1946



Sales of electric storage batteries and parts by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$1,016,172 during September, 1946, compared with \$890,782 in August, 1946. The sales for September included 150,755 batteries at \$796,508 for the ignition of internal combustion engines; 433 batteries at \$1,917 for motorcycle starting; 8,322 cells at \$74,954 for farm lighting plants; 1,074 cells at \$24,670 for railway services; batteries valued at \$66,787 for other purposes, including those for telephone switchboards, and miscellaneous parts and supplies for batteries valued at \$51,336.

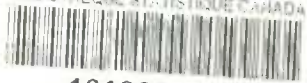
