THE ELECTRICAI APPARATUS INDUSTRY, 1218.
A preliminary report on the above industry for the calendar year 1918 has been completed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, covering the operations of 68 plants. Distributed according to location, ontario hed 42 plants, quebec 13. Manitoba 7, British Columbia 3, Alberta 2 and Saskatchewan 1.

Capital Investment.
The total capital investment for the Dominion was $\$ 43,285,405$, of which $\$ 10,636,572$ was in land, buildings and fixtures: $\$ 6,518,132$ in machinery and tools; $\$ 17,071,528$ in mater: ials, stocks in process, finished products, fuel and miscellaneons supplies on hand as per inventory; and $\$ 9,059,173$ in Working capital. Of the total investment, ontario contributed $\$ 26,426,129$, Quebec $\$ 16,525,454$, Manitoba $\$ 253,026$, British Columbia $\$ 42,881$. Alberta $\$ 19,736$ and Saskatchewan $\$ 18,179$.

Fuel Consumption.
The total value of all fuel used during the year amounted to $\$ 497,074$, of which $\$ 87,325$ was of Canadian origin and $\$ 409,749$ of foreign origin. Coal used amounted to 52,328 tons valued at $\$ 328,165$; coke, 1,880 tons valued at $\$ 21,310$; Easoline 15,120 gallons worth $\$ 5,528$; fuel oil 373,681 gallons worth $\$ 41,=$ 607; wood 237 cords worth $\$ 1,928$; gas, natural and artificial, $14,814 \mathrm{~m}$. cubic feet worth $\$ 27,106$; and other fuel for which no uantity is given to the value of $\$ 17,430$.
