CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LIME PRODUCTION - JANUARY, 1935.

CEMENT - Shipments of Portland cement by Canadian producers amounted to 53,479 barrels in January as compared with 82,498 barrels in December and 68,784 barrels in January, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Exports of Portland cement from Canada in January declined to 616 barrels from the December total of 7,108 barrels and the January, 1934, total of 847 barrels.

Canada imported 239 barrels of cement worth \$623 during January as against 1,331 barrels at \$4,005 in December and 506 barrels at \$2,298 in January, 1934. The January, 1935, importations were obtained from the United States.

CLAY PRODUCTS - Canadian producers sold clay and clay products valued at \$79,976 in January; during the preceding month sales were valued at \$119,938 and in January, 1934, the value of sales was \$115,353.

Exports of clay and clay products from Canada declined in value to \$12,294 from the December total of \$26,495 and the January, 1934, total of \$21,615.

Canada imported clay and clay products to a value of \$448,407 as compared with \$405,305 in December and \$359,648 in January, 1934. The United States supplied 49.4 per cent of the January, 1935, importations; Great Britain, 39.1 per cent; Japan, 9.4 per cent, and Germany, France, Belgium, Italy, Palestine, China, the Netherlands, Czechoslovakia, Hong Kong, Denmark, Sweden, and Poland, the remainder.

LIME - The Canadian production of lime in February advanced to 29,018 tons from the January total of 28,873 tons and the February, 1934, output of 27,388 tons. During January and February, 1935, Canada produced 57,891 tons of lime as compared with 53,448 tons in the corresponding months of 1934.

Lime exportations from Canada were recorded at 616 tons in February; during the previous month 269 tons were exported.

Imports of lime into Canada in February amounted to 29 tons worth \$359 as against 66 tons at \$1,399 imported in January.
