CFMANT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LIITE PRODUCTION - MARCH, 1935.

CEMENT - Canadian producers shipped 130,747 barrels of Portland cement during March, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In February, 70,776 barrele were shipped and in Narch, 1934, shipments amounted to 107,425 barrels. Portiand cement shipments during the first quarter of 1835 totalled 255,002 barrels as compared with 242,780 barrels a year ago.

Exports of Portland cement from Canada in March declined to 156 barrels from the February total of 1,098 barrels.

Canada imported 1,295 barrels worth $\$ 4.491$ ir March as compared with 1,636 barrels worth $\$ 5,255$ imported in February. The March importations were made up of 664 barrels from the United States and 631 barrels from Gruat Britain.

CLAY PRODUCTS - During March, 1935, sales of clay products made from domestic clays by lianadian producors were valued at $\$ 137,000$; in tho preceding month the value of sales was $£ 88,873$ and in March, a year aco, the total was $\$ 130,128$. Sales during tho first quarter of 1935 wero valuod at $\psi 305,849$ as compared with $\$ 341,909$ in the corresponding puriod of 1934.

Exports of clay and clay products from Canada in March rose to a valuation of $\$ 45,123$ from the Fobruary total of $\$ 14,898$. South Africa was the principal purchaser of these cormodities in March.

Canada importod clay and cley products to a value of 4555,524 in March; the United States supplied 44.2 per cont of those imports; Groat Britain, 44.1 per cent; Japan, 9.2 per cont; and Gormny, Czochoslovikia, Franco, Italy, Bolgium, Yalestine, Hong Kong, Chine, the Nothorlands and Austria, the remeinder. In February tho Canadian importations wero appraisud at $\$ 423,528$ of which Great Britain supplied 45.4 per cent; the United Stato3, 44,8 per cont; Japan, 6.6 por cent, and Germany, France, Czechoslovekis, Bolgium, Falustino, China, Swodon, Hong Kong, Italy, Mexico, and the British Fiost Indius, the romainder.

LIME - Lime production in Canadn during ipril reachod a total of 35,148 tons as compared with 32,616 tons in the preceding month and 28,653 tons in 4 pril, 1934. Production during the period January to April, ly35, totallod 125,656 tons or 8.0 per cent above the tonnage produced in the corresponding period of 1934.

Canada exported 581 tons of lime during hpril; in the preceding month 64 ? tons were exported.

Customs' records show that 19 tons of lime valued at $\$ 586$ were imported into Canada in $厶$ pril as egainst 55 tons at $\$ 688$ in March. Theso importations wero obtained from the Unitud States.
