CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LIME PRODUCTION - JUNE, 1935.

CEMENT - Portland cement production in Canada during June was recorded at 430,884 barrels, according to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In May, 387,684 barrels were shipped while in June, 1934, shipments totalled 520,832 barrels. During the first six months of 1935 shipments amounted to 1,317,744 barrels or 2.8 per cent below the total for the corresponding period of 1934.

Customs' records show that 3,083 barrels of Portland cement were exported 110m Canada in June; during the preceding month 5,186 barrels were exported.

Imports of cement into Canada during June included 973 barrels worth \$2,547 from Great Britain, 691 barrels at \$3,417 from the United States and 32 barrels at \$121 from Italy. In May, 1,270 barrels valued at \$3,870 were imported from Great Britain, 551 barrels at \$2,630 from the United States, 157 barrels at \$190 from Belgium and 32 barrels at \$120 from Italy.

CLAY PRODUCTS - Sales of clay and clay products by Canadian producers in June were valued at \$287,705 as compared with the May total of \$259,689 and the June, 1934, sales of \$259,094. During the first six months of 1935 sales were valuedou at \$1,044,181; this represented a decline of 1.2 per cent from the total for the period January to June, 1934.

Exports of clay and clay products from Canada in June were appraised at \$20,703; the May exports were worth \$33,698. South Africa, British India and the United States were the principal importers of these commodities in June.

Clay and clay products imported into Canada in June declined 9.6 per cent in value to \$540,970 from the May total of \$598,140. The following countries were the sources of the Canadian imports in June: Great Britain, 49.6 per cent; the United States, 37.3 per cent; Japan, 8.4 per cent; and Germany, France, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Palestine, Italy, China, Hong Kong, Sweden and Poland, the remainder.

LIME - The Canadian production of lime in July rose to 33,126 tons from the June total of 32,451 tons and the July, 1934, output of 31,237 tons. Production during the seven months ending July totalled 225,447 tons or 5.2 per cent above the tonpage produced during the period January to July, 1934.

Exports of lime from Camada in July were recorded at 284 tons as against 578 tons in the previous month. Exportations of lime from Canada during the period January to July, 1935, amounted to 3,144 tons.

Canada imported in July 97 tons of lime valued at \$1,307; in June, 27 tons at \$341 were imported. During the first seven months of the current year 344 tons of lime valued at \$5,358 were brought into Canada.
