MONTHLY REPORT

CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LIME PRODUCTION - OCTOBER, 1936.

<u>Cement</u> - Shipments of Portland cement by Canadian producers in October totalled 566,940 barrels; in the preceding month, 701,763 barrels were shipped, while in October, a year ago, 517,219 barrels were shipped, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. A 23.7 per cent advance was recorded in shipments during the first ten months of 1936 as compared with the corresponding period of 1935; the totals were 4,039,176 barrels and 3,264,073 barrels, respectively.

Portland cement exports from Canada in October rose to 7,153 barrels from the September total of 5,865 barrels. During the period January to October 51,859 barrels were exported from Canada.

Imports of cement into Canada in October consisted of 3,296 barrels from Great Britain, 938 barrels from the United States, 91 barrels from Belgium and 31 barrels from Italy. In September, 2,719 barrels were received from Great Britain, 1,659 barrels from the United States and 45 barrels from the Netherlands and Japan.



CLAY PRODUCTS - Reports from producers of clay and clay products in Canada from domestic clay, indicated that sales of these materials in October were valued at \$341,145 as compared with \$368,652 in September and \$374,449 in October, 1935. Sales during the ten months ending October were recorded at \$2,720,660 or 6.3 per cent above the total for the corresponding period of 1935.

Exports of clay and clay products from Canada in October were valued at \$39,626; this represented a decline of 28.8 per cent from the September total of \$55,681. India, the United States and Sweden were the principal importers of these commodities in October.



-Clay and clay products imported into Canada in November were appraised at \$687,137 of which Great Britain supplied 54.7 per cent; the United States, 34.8 per cent; Japan, 4.2 per cent; Germany, 2.8 per cent; Belgium, 1.7 per cent, and Czechoslovakia, France, China, Palestine, Hong Kong, Italy, Denmark, the Netherlands. and Austria, the remainder. The October importations were valued at \$656,610.

LIME - Canadian producers shipped 42,613 ions of lime in November as compared with 45,170 tons shipped in October and 37,534 tons in November, 1935. During the period January to November, 1.936, Canadian shipments totalled 405,505 tons or 8.9 per cent above the total for the corresponding months of 1935.

Customs' records show that 1,062 tons of lime were exported from Canada in November; in the preceding month, 1,319 tons were exported.

Lime importations into Canada in November amounted to 176 tons worth \$2,152 as against 71 tons at \$900 imported in October. Imports during the eleven months ending November, 1936, totalled 828 tons.
