## MONTHLY REPORT

## CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LIME PRODUCTION - JUNE, 1936.

Gement - Portland coment shipments by Canadian producers advanced to 559,52. barrels in June from the May total af 418,839 barrols and the June, 1935 shipinonts of 434, 806 barrels, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first six months of 1936 shipments totalled 1,629,941 barrels, or 22.6 per cent above the quantity shipped in the corresponding perioc of 1935.

Customs' records show that 4,250 barrels of Portland cement were erpertja from Canada in June, as compared with 8,198 barrels in the preceding month.

The Canadian imports of cement amounted to 4,455 barrels worth $\$ 9, r 77$; in May 6,333 barrels at $\$ 18,175$ were imported. The Juna importations were obtained fron the following countries: Great Britain, 2,810 barrels; the United States, 1,055 brrrels; Germany, 558 barrels, and Belgium, 32 barrels.

Clay Products - Canadian producers reported sales of clay and clay producta to a value of $\$ 343,591$ in June; the preceding month's sales were valued at $\$ 306,825$ and the June, 1935 sales, $\$ 317,127$. Sales during the first $s i x$ months of 1936 had a total value of $\$ 1,260,291$; this represented an increase of 9.5 per cent over the cerresponding period of 1935 .

Exports of clay and clay products from Canada in June were valued at \$41, 169 as against the May total of $\$ 31,246$. South Africa was the principal importer of these commditles from Eanada in June.

Clay and clay products imported into Canada in June were appraised at $\$ 623,874$, or 7.9 per cent below the May import valuation of $\$ 677,551$. The June imports were received from the following sources: Great Britain, 54.7 per cent; the United States, 35,7 per cent; Japan, 4.6 per cent, Germany, 3.0 per cent, and Czechoslovaksa, Belgium, France, China, Finland, Hing Kong, Sweden, Denmark, Poland, Palestine, Spain. Imports of clay and clay products into Canada in July were appraised at $\$ 642,542$ as compared with the June valuation of $\$ 623, \varepsilon 74$. The following countries were the sources of the July importations: Great Britain, 51.9 per cent; the United States, 37.7 per cent; Japan, 5.3 per cent; Germany, 3.1 per cent, and Belgium, France, Czechoslovakia, China, Hong Kong, Netherlands, Austria, Palestine, Sweden, Italy, Denmark and India, the remainder.

LIME - Shipments of lime from Canadiar kilns in July amounted to 36,927 tons; in the preceding month, 37,294 tons were shipped while in July, 1.935; the total was 34,018 tons. During the sevin months ending July, 241,024 tons of canadian lime were shipped as against 227,803 tors, a year ago.

Customs' records shcw that 958 tons of lime were exported lrom Canada in July; during June, 1,374 tons were exported. Canada exported 6,526 tons of lime during the first seven months of 1936.

Receipts of lime in July were recorded at 3 解 tons appraised at $\$ 772$ as compared with 3 tons at $\$ 102$ imported in June. Imports during the periud January to July, 1936, totalled 308 tons.
