CEMENT - Shipments of Portland cement by Canadian producers in January amounted to 97,276 barrels according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In December, 155,686 barrels were shipped while in January, 1936, shipments totalled 96,512 barrels.

Exports of Portland cement from Canada were recorded at 1,616 barrels as compared with 8,220 barrels exported in December.

Imports of cement into Canada in January declined to 1,745 barrels valued at \$3,827 from the December total of 2,944 barrels worth \$6,149. Great Britain supplied 75.3 per cent of the January importations and the United States, the remainder. In January, 1936, Canada imported 413 barrels appraised at \$1,377.

CLAY PRODUCTS - Sales of clay and clay products by Canadian producers were valued at \$135,648 in January as compared with the December valuation of \$200,772 and the January, 1936, total of \$117,050.

Customs' records show that Canada exported in January clay and clay products to a value of \$26,756; during the preceding month the exports were worth \$55,856. South Africa, the United States and China were the principal importers of these commodities in January.

Clay and clay products imports during the month were valued at \$583,485 as against the total for the previous month of \$656,245. The following countries were the sources of the January importations: the United States, 58.7 per cent; Great Britain, 35.2 per cent and Japan, Germany, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, China, Finland, Palestine, Hong Kong, Denmark, Italy, Austria, the Netherlands, Bermuda and Hungary, the remainder.

LIME - Shipments of lime from Canadian kilns during March amounted to 46,583 tons; in February, 39,979 tons were shipped, while in March, 1936, shipments totalled 32,929 tons. A 36.9 per cent advance was recorded in the tonnage shipped during the first three months of 1937 as compared with the total for the corresponding period of 1936; the quantities were 124,939 tons and 91,268 tons, respectively.

Lime exports from Canada rose to 2,171 tons in March from the previous month's total of 160 tons. During the first quarter of the year under review, 2,735 tons of lime were exported from Canada.

Imports of lime into Canada in March were recorded at 123 tons worth \$1,289; in February 75 tons at \$728 were imported.
