## MONTHLY REPORT

CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LTME PRODUCTION - MARCH, 1937.

CENENT - Shipments of Portland cement by Canedien producers in March rose to 209,743 barrels from the preceaing month's total of 101,171 barrels and the March, 1936, total of 167,129 barrels, accoraing to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first quarter of the current year, 408,190 barrels of Portland cement mere shipper as compared with 358,243 barrels in the corresponding period of 1936.

In March, Canada exported 1,530 barrels of cement; during the previous month 44 barrels were exported. Peru and Bermuda wore the principal importers of Canadien cement in March.

The Canadian imports of cement in March advanced to 2,126 barrels worth $\$ 12,049$ from the February importations of 525 barrels at $\$ 2,862$. The March receipts consisted of 1,231 barrels from Great Britain and 895 barrols from the United States.

CLAY PRODUCTS ~ Clay and clay products sold by Canadian producers in Narch were valued at $\$ 178,431$ as against the previous winth's valuation of $\$ 1.27,313$ and the March, 1936, total of $\$ 163,873$. Sales during January, February and March aggregated $\$ 441,392$ or 15.2 per cent above the total for the corresponding period of 1936 ,

Customs' records show that Canada exported, in March, clay and its products to a value of $\$ 33,189$; the February exports were worth $\$ 28,349$. India, the United States, Portuguese Hfrica, Brazil, Australia, and New Zealand wore the principal countries to which these commodities were shipped in March.

Imports of clay ond its products into Canada in March were valued at $\$ 802,799$ as compared with the preceding month's import valuation of $\$ 589,786$. The March importations were obtained principally from the following countries: the United States, 51.5 per cent; Great Britain, 39.8 per cent; Japan, 7.1 per cent and Germany, l.I per cent.

LIME - Lime shipments from Canadian kilns in hpril reached a total of 47,750 tons; during the previous month 46,583 tons were shipped while in April, 1936, shipments amounted to 36,296 tons. an advance of 35.4 per cent was recorded in the tonnage of lime shipped during the first four months of 1937 as compared with the corresponding period of 1936 ; the quentities were 172,689 tons and 127,564 tons, respectively.

Exports of lime from Canada declined to 36 tons in April from the Narch total of 2,171 tons; in April, a year ago, 1,019 tons were exported.

Canada imported 88 tons of lime worth $¢ 861$ in April as compared with 123 tons at \$1,289 imported in Merch.
