CEMENT - Canadian producers reported shipments of Portland cement amounting to 909,220 barrels in August as compared with the July total of 832,720 barrels and the August, 1936, total of 608,780 barrels, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Shipments during the first eight months of 1937 aggregated 3,831,946 barrels; a year ago, 2,804,531 barrels were shipped.

Canada exported 7,305 barrels of Portland cement in August as against 4,380 barrels in the preceding month. Exports during the eight months ending August were recorded at 40,128 barrels or 3.3 per cent above the total for the corresponding period of 1936.

Imports of cement into Canada during August amounted to 8,290 barrels worth \$18,197; in July, 4,531 barrels at \$10,333 were imported. The August receipts consisted of 3,777 barrels from Great Britain, 3,155 barrels from Belgium, and 1,358 barrels from the United States.

CLAY PRODUCTS - Sales of clay and clay products by Canadian producers in August were valued at \$485,653; this represented a decrease of 5.1 per cent from the July total and an increase of 18.4 per cent over the August, 1936, total. During the first eight months of 1937 sales rose 18.6 per cent in value to \$2,594,151 from the total for the corresponding months of 1936.

Clay and its products exported from Canada in August were valued at \$92,399; during the previous month the export valuation was \$70,578.

The value of imports of clay and its products into Canada in August declined 10.3 per cent to \$749,432 from the July total of \$835,619. The receipts during August were obtained from the following sources: Great Britain, 47.0 per cent; the United States, 43.8 per cent; Japan, 5.1 per cent; Germany, 2.3 per cent, and Belgium, Czechoslovakia, France, Palestine, China, Italy, Finland, Hong Kong, Turkey, Hungary, and the Netherlands, the remainder.

LIME - Limo shipments from Canadian kilns in September amounted to 42,125 tons as compared with 44,178 tons in August and 42,011 tons in September, 1936. Shipments during the nine months ending September totalled 401,421 tons or 20.2 per cent above the total for the corresponding period, a year ago.

Ten tons of limo were exported from Canada in September; during the preceding month, exports were recorded at 1,448 tons. Exportations during the first nine months of 1937 aggregated 8,073 tons.

Imports of limo into Canada advanced to 1,144 tons appraised at \$8,667 from the August receipts of 796 tons at \$3,867.
