## MONTHLY REPORT

CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LINE PRODUCTION - SEPTEMBER, 1937.

CEMENT - Shipments of Portland cement by Canadian producers rose to 937,749 barrels in September from the August total of 909,220 barrels and the September, 1936 total of 710,390 barrels, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first nine months of 1937, Canada shipped 4,769,695 barrels of Portland cement as compared with 3,514,921 barrels shipped, a year ago.

Exports of Portland cement from Canada in September declined 56.4 por cent to 3,186 barrels. During the period January to September, 1937, Canadian producers exported 43,314 barrels of Portland coment; this represented a decrease of 3.1 per cent from the total for the corresponding months of 1936.

Canada imported 5,990 barrels of cement worth \$12,460 as against 8,290 barrels at \$18,197 in August. The Septembor importations were made up of 3,915 barrels from Belgium, 1,271 barrels from the United States, 535 barrels from Germany, 263 barrels from Great Britain and 6 barrels from Japan.

CLAY PRODUCTS - Canadian producers reported sales of clay and clay products valued at \$496,091 in September; during the previous month, sales were worth \$485,653 while the September, 1936 sales valuation was \$401,056. An advance of 19.4 per cent was recorded in salos during the first nine months of 1937 as compared with the total for the corresponding period of 1936; the values were \$3,090,242 and \$2,588,674, respectively.

Exports of clay and its products from Canada in September were valued at \$82,152; the August exports were worth \$92,399. South Africa, Sweden, Great Britain, the United States and Belgium were the principal importers of these Canadian products.

Imports of clay and its products into Canada doclined 4.6 per cent in value to \$715,186 in Soptomber. During the month under review, the United States supplied 49.6 por cent of the Canadian imports of these commodities, Great Britain, 42.0 per cent; Japan, 4.0 per cent; Germany, 2.5 per cent and Czechoslovakia, Belgium, Franco, Italy, Palostino, China, Hong Kong, Poland, Sweden, Denmark, Greece, French Africa, Morocco, the Nothorlands, Mexico, Jamaica and Austria, the remainder.

LIME - Shipments of lime from Canadian kilns totalled 47,301 tons in October; in September, 42,125 tons were shipped and in October, 1936, shipments amounted to 46,132 tons. During the ten months ending October, 448,722 tons of lime were shipped while in the corresponding period, a year ago, shipments were lower at 580,197 tons.

Exports of lime from Canada in October were recorded at 354 tons; during the preceding month 10 tons were exported. Shipments of lime from Canada during the period January to October, 1937, aggregated 3,427 tons.

Lime imports in October declined to 559 tons at \$3,214 from the previous month's total of 1,144 tons worth \$8,667.
