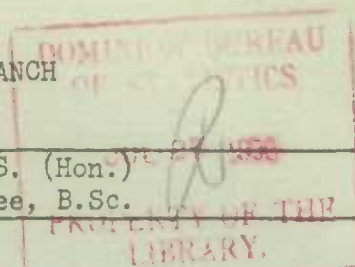

MONTHLY REPORTHistorical File CopyCEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS AND LIME - MAY, 1938.

CEMENT - Shipments of Portland cement from Canadian plants in May rose to 545,310 barrels from the preceding month's total of 364,096 barrels and the May, 1937, shipments of 557,294 barrels, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the five months ending May, 1,418,414 barrels were shipped compared with 1,337,323 barrels in the corresponding period of 1937.

Exports of Portland cement from Canada in May were recorded at 6,032 barrels; in April, 182 barrels were exported.

Imports of cement into Canada in May totalled 5,901 barrels with a valuation of \$11,546 and consisted of 4,341 barrels at \$4,858 from Belgium, 1,122 barrels at \$4,510 from the United States and 438 barrels at \$2,178 from Great Britain.

CLAY PRODUCTS - Sales of clay products (produced from domestic clays) were valued at \$379,824 in May compared with \$264,689 in the preceding month and \$379,967 in May, 1937. During the first five months of the current year Canadian producers sold clay products to a value of \$1,135,561; in the corresponding period of 1937 the value of sales was \$1,110,631.

Exports of clay and its products from Canada in May were worth \$39,767; the April exports were valued at \$88,980.

Imports of these commodities into Canada in May were appraised at \$772,554 or 24.2 per cent above the April total. The May receipts were obtained from the following sources: Great Britain, 65.6 per cent; the United States, 27.5 per cent; Japan, 3.0 per cent; Germany, 1.9 per cent, and Czechoslovakia, France, Belgium, Palestine, Italy, Hong Kong, Hungary, Netherlands, Denmark, China and Bermuda, the remainder.

LIME - Shipments of lime from Canadian kilns declined to 40,021 tons in June from the May total of 41,756 tons and the June, 1937, shipments of 47,114 tons. During the first six months of the current year, 224,763 tons were shipped compared with 269,314 tons a year ago.

Three hundred and ninety-seven tons of lime were exported from Canada in June; during the preceding month 686 tons were exported.

Canada imported 539 tons of lime worth \$2,979 in June compared with 583 tons at \$2,733 imported in May.
