CEMENT. CLIY PRODUC TS and LIME - AUGUST, 1938.

CELENT - Canadian producers reportod shipments of Portland coment amounting to 711,753 barrels in iugust compared with 644,424 barrels in the preceding month and 913,533 barrels in August, 1937 , according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Shipments during the oight months onding August totalled $3,523,638$ barrols 3 a yoar ago, $3,850,121$ barrels woro shippod while in the corresponding months of 1936 o shipments amounted to $2,304,531$ barrelso

Canada exported 9861 barrels of Portland coment in $\Lambda$ ugust or 36.3 per cent abovo the quantity shippod from this country in the preceding month. colombia received 28.1 per cent of tho diugust exports and Janaica 22.2 per cent.

Imports of cement during iugust totalled 3, 859 barrels appraised at $\$ 7,259$ and inoluded 2, 552 barrels at $\$ 3,306$ from Belgiun, 924 barrols at $\$ 2,125$ fram the United States and 383 barrels at $\$ 1,828$ from Great Britain.

CLiY PRODUCTS - Sales of clay products (produced from domestic clays) were valued at $\$ 504,871$ in iugust; the July sales wore worth $\$ 468,608$ and tho August, 1937 sales valuation was $\$ 517,652$ 。 During tho first oight months of 1938 , sales were worth $\$ 2,537,567$ compared with $\$ 2,765,030$ a year ngo and $\$ 2,187,618$ in the corresponding poriod of 1936.

Exports of clay and its products doclined in value to $\$ 24.150$ from the July total of $\$ 39,732$. The aggregato for the yoar to dato was $\$ 360,618$ or 6 per cont below the total for the period, January to fugusts 1937.

Recoipts of clay and clay products during August wore valued at $\$ 611,582$ or 9.7 per cent below the Juily import valuationo The iugust imports were obtained from the following sources: Groat Britain, 5308 per cont; the United States, 38.3 per cent Japan, 3.5 per cent; Gormany, lo7 per cont; CzochosIovalia, lo3 per cont; and other countries, 1.4 per conto

The following countries werc the sources of the Sentember importations: Great Britain, 48.2 per cont; the United States, 44.9 per cent; Japen, 2.1 ner cent; Germeny, 1.5 per cent; Czechoslovakia, 1.3 per cent, and other countries, 1.4 per cent.

LIME - Shiments of lime from Canadian kilns during Sentember anounted to 20, 474 tons compred with 41,208 tons in hupust and 43,537 tons in Seotomiver, 1837 . The Conedion shipments during the nine months ending Sentember totalled 345,567 tons; a ysor o.go, \&16,022 tons were shimped while in the correspondine months of $19 ? 6$ the totol was 334,065 tons.

Cands exported 398 tons of lime in Sentember; during the preceding month 509 tons wore exmorted.

An increuse of 59.4 ner cent was shorm in the imyorts of lime into Canada in Sentamber when CRU tons at, 3,069 were brought into this country from the United St: tos compared vith 308 tons orth $\$ 2,168$ in durust.
