MONTHLY REPORT

CEMENT, CLAY PRODUCTS and LIME - JANUARY, 1940

CEMENT - Canadian producers reported shipments amounting to 190,575 barrels in January, during the preceding month, 205,603 barrels were shipped while in January, 1939 shipments totalled 115,533 barrels, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Exports of Portland cement from Canada in January declined to 78 barrels worth \$198 from the December total of 19,913 barrels at \$20,987.

Canada imported 874 barrels of cement valued at \$1,442 compared with 756 barrels with a valuation of \$4,386 imported in the preceding month.

CLAY PRODUCTS - The value of the sales of clay and clay products (produced from domestic clays) was \$214,744 in January compared with \$307,206 in the previous month, and \$158,028 in January, 1939.

Canada exported clay and its products to a value of \$43,791 in January; the December exports were valued at \$43,583.

Imports of clay and its products into Canada were 4.1 per cent lower; the month's total was \$775,192 as against the December valuation of \$808,711.

LIME - The Canadian production of lime in February totalled 47,472 tons; in January, 51,863 tons were produced. The February output included 43,049 tons of quicklime and 4,423 tons of hydrated lime.

Canada exported 451 tons of building lime in February and 678 tons of other lime. These exports were consigned to the United States and Peru.

Importations of lime during February were recorded at 496 tons appraised at \$2,567 compared with 419 tons worth \$2,244 imported in January.
