

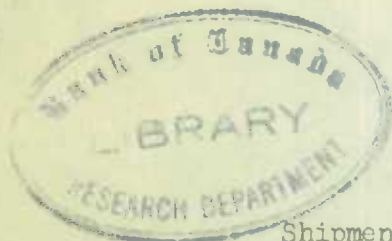
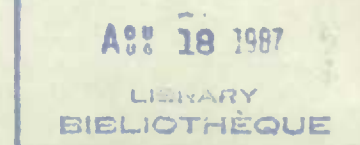

CEMENT AND CEMENT PRODUCTSMAY - 1949

Shipments to customers by Canadian manufacturers of Portland Cement totalled 1,469,533 barrels in May, 1949 compared with 1,535,469 barrels in April. In 1948 the May shipments amounted to 1,412,253 barrels as against 1,266,731 barrels in the previous month. Actual production for May, 1949 was 1,378,013 barrels compared with 1,099,837 barrels in the corresponding month of 1948.

The May output of concrete building materials included the following items: brick, 2,876,701 pieces; hollow blocks, 3,702,017 pieces; cinder blocks, 844,776 pieces; chimney blocks, 15,583 pieces; and pipe, 10,965 tons. These figures represent production by 98 of the principal manufacturers which normally account for 85 per cent of the total Canadian output of concrete products.
