# NON-METALLIC MINERAL PRODUCTS

1949

## General Review

The new Standard Industrial Classification which has been used by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in its compilations for 1949 provides for a separate Products from Petroleum and Coal Group. This new major division includes the petroleum products industry and the coke and gas industry which were formerly classified to the Manufactures of the Non-Metallic Minerals Group. The statistics for the Non-Metallic Mineral Products Group in 1949, therefore, are not strictly comparable with those published previously. The principal statistics for 1949 on a comparative basis are given in Tables 1 and 2 of this report but other details are not available for earlier years.

The gross value of production from industries in this group was \$246,457,799 in 1949, an increase of 6.2 per cent over 1948. Employees numbered 28,302 in 1949 and their salaries and wages totalled \$65,098,797. Materials for manufacturing cost \$78,401,065 at the works and fuel and electricity cost \$24,184,119.

Ten of the industries showed increases in output values compared with 1948, and three showed declines. The percentage increases were as follows:— asbestos products, 28; cement, 14.7; cement products, 24.8; glass, 5; gypsum products, 10.7; lime, 6.5; products from domestic clays, 2; products from imported clays, 16.9; salt, 13.6; and stone, 28.8. Abrasive products declined 17.4 per cent; the miscellaneous industry fell off 25.9 per cent; and the sand-lime brick industry declined 5 per cent.

In 1949 there were 1,020 establishments in this group. Ontario with 479 works and production at \$133,264,802 accounted for 54 per cent of the total output and for 52 per cent of the employees. Quebec's 276 plants with 7,868 employees and production worth \$68,213,172 accounted for 28 per cent and 27 per cent respectively of the Canada totals.
