NON-METALLIC MINERAL PRODUCTS 1956

GENERAL REVIEW

The new Standard Industrial Classification, which has been used by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in its compilations for 1949 and later years, provides for a separate Products of Petroleum and Coal group. This new major division includes the petroleum products industry and the coke and gas industry which were formerly classified to the Non-metallic Mineral Products group. The statistics for the Non-metallic Mineral Products group, from and including 1949, therefore, are not strictly comparable with those published previously.

The gross value of production from industries in this group was \$573 millions in 1956, an increase of 11 per cent over 1955. Employees numbered 40,165 in 1956 and their salaries and wages totalled \$143 millions. Materials for manufacturing cost \$207 millions and fuel and electricity cost \$46 millions.

Ten of the industries in this group showed increases in output values compared with 1955 and three industries registered slight declines. For the first group the values in millions of dollars (1955 in brackets) were as follows: Abrasives products, \$46.0 (\$42.5); Asbestos products, \$34.2 (\$30.1); cement, \$78.6 (\$68.8); concrete products, \$155.4 (\$133.8); glass and glass products, \$87.1 (\$80.8); miscellaneous \$21.6 (\$17.8); products from domestic clays \$37.8 (\$35.3); products from imported clays \$21.0 (\$18.4); salt \$14.0 (\$11.9); stone products \$27.8 (\$25.0). Three industries showed slight declines as follows: gypsum products \$31.3 (\$31.5); lime \$16.5 (\$16.6) and sand-lime bricks \$1.3 (\$1.6).

In 1956 there were 1,183 establishments in this group. Ontario with 527 and production at \$292.7 millions accounted for 51.1 per cent of the total output and for 50.7 of the employees. Quebec's 348 plants with 11,783 employees and production worth \$169.2 millions accounted for 29.3 per cent and 29.5 per cent respectively of the Canada totals.

Note: Where shipments data are available the net value of production is arrived at by subtracting from the value of factory shipments the cost of materials and supplies used and fuel and electricity used and adjusting for changes in inventory. In 1955 the "Value added" adjustment incorporated the increase or decrease to shipments values resulting from the changes in the value of inventories over the period. For 1955 the adjustments that were made used only the change in finished product inventory owned by manufacturers. In 1956 the calculation of the "Value added" figure was further adjusted to take into account the "Goods in process" as well as the finished goods held at plant or plant warehouse.

Where production data are available the net value is arrived at as above except that no adjustments for inventory changes are necessary.
