

## THE ASBESTOS PRODUCTS INDUSTRY

1950

Production by the manufacturers of asbestos goods in Canada in 1950 was valued at \$13,818,919, an increase of 33.6 per cent over the 1949 total of \$10,343,009. The products included brake linings at \$2,287,044, boiler and pipe covering at \$1,231,995, clutch facings at \$556,570, asbestos packings at \$315,594, and such other lines as asbestos gaskets, cloth, yarn, dryer felts, cements, cement pipe, etc.

Fifteen factories were included in this industry, of which 6 were located in Quebec, 6 in Ontario, 1 in Nova Scotia, and 2 in British Columbia. The number of employees totalled 1,656, and payments in salaries and wages for the year amounted to \$3,890,249. Expenditures for fuel and electricity totalled \$518,886, and materials for manufacturing cost \$6,904,017.
