THE ASBESTOS PRODUCTS INDUSTRY

1957

Factory shipments by the manufacturers of asbestos goods in Canada in 1957 were valued at \$29.988.123. The products included brake linings at \$3,582,048; boiler and pipe coverings at \$1,786,790; asbestos packings, at \$692,265; asbestos textile products, at \$5,100,432; asbestos paper products, at \$562,264 and such other lines as cements, cement pipe, tank jackets, boiler covers, etc.

Seventeen factories were included in this industry in 1957, of which 9 were located in Ontario, 5 in Quebec, 2 in British Columbia and 1 in Nova Scotia. The number of employees totalled 2,222 and payments for salaries and wages for the year amounted

to \$8,311.653. Expenditures for fuel and electricity totalled \$853,483 and materials for manufacturing cost \$13,693,806.

Note: Due to lack of inventory data, figures for value added by manufacture prior to 1954 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the total value of factory shipments. In 1954 and 1955 the "Value added" adjustment incorporated the increase or decrease to shipments values resulting from changes in the value of inventories over the period, For these two years, the adjustments that were made used only the change in finished product inventory owned by manufacturers. Beginning with 1956 the calculation of the "Value added" figure was further adjusted to take into account the "Goods in process" as well as the finished goods held at plant or plant warehouse.
