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THE GIASS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1928.

Production of the glass industry in Canada during 1928 was valued at \$13,565,354, according to a bulletin issued by the Dominica Eureau of Statistics at Ottawa. This output was 3 per cent under the record value of \$14,021,778 reported for the previous year and slightly less than the next high value of \$13,795,690 attained in 1920. The 59 firms engaged in the manufacture of glass products during 1928 reported capital employed at \$12,694,882, average monthly employment at 3,219 and salaries and wages at \$3,878,165. Purchased materials cost \$4,791,486 and the value added by manufacturing was \$8,773,870.

Pressed and blown glass was produced in 7 plants in Canada during 1928; of these 5 actually manufactured glass and 2 made vials and other special apparatus from tubes, rods, etc. Factories were located as follows: 4 in Ontario, ? in Quebec and 1 in Alberta. Production was valued at \$9,466,382 as compared with \$10,232,634 in the previous year and \$8,390,035 in 1926.

In the plate, cut, and ornamental glass section which includes all plants engaged in bevelling, cutting or working glass to produce such commodities as mirrors, cut glass, bevelled plate, memorial and ornamental windows, etc., the number of operating concerns totalled 52 distributed by provinces as follows: 32 in Ontario, 9 in Quebec, 5 in British 3 in Manitoba, and 1 in each of New Prunswick, Nova Scotia and Alberta. Production Columbia, from these factories was valued at \$4,098,972 as against \$3,789,144 for 1927 and \$3,280,234 in 1926.

Imports of glass and glassware into Canada during the calendar year 1928 reached a ' value of \$9,294,095 as compared with \$8,146,698 in the previous year. Among the principal lines imported were 45.5 million square feet of common or colourless window glass valued at \$1,179,052; other plate and sheet glass, \$2,921,210; glass carboys, dantjohns, bettles, etc., \$1,485,205; glass tableware of all kinds, \$1,041,826. Other lines imported included lenses, lamp bulbs, silvered glass, glass designed to be cut or mounted, spectacles, eyeglasses, etc. Exports of glass and glassware during 1928 were appraised at \$150,265 in 1928 and \$129,958 in 1927.
