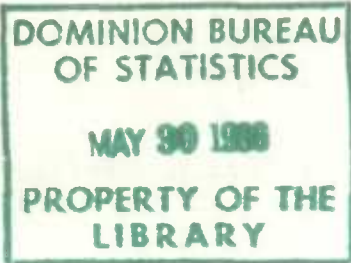

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OTHER NON-METALLIC MINERAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRIES

1966

For statistical purposes the industry titled Other Non-metallic Mineral Products Industries in the revised Standard Industrial Classification covers the operations of establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing miscellaneous non-metallic mineral products not elsewhere classified, such as mica products, expanded vermiculite, expanded perlite, roofing granules. Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing petroleum and coal products are classified to the Petroleum and Coal Products Industries.

Value of shipments and other revenue (manufacturing and non-manufacturing) of the Other Non-metallic Mineral Products Industries amounted to \$19.4 millions in 1966, compared with \$17.9 millions in 1965, an increase of \$1.5 millions or about 9 per cent. Included in this total were shipments of foundry supplies (facings, partings, core oil, etc.), expanded perlite, expanded vermiculite and other light weight aggregates valued at \$6.0 millions. Other products shipped by this industry included porcelain enamel frit, fabricated mica, ground earths, roofing granules, etc. Other revenue (non-manufacturing) amounted to \$2.3 millions.

The cost of materials and supplies, etc. used in the production of goods of own manufacture increased by \$400,000. Cost of materials and supplies, etc. (inputs) in 1966 represented 50.5 per cent of value of shipments of own manufacture (outputs) compared to 50 per cent in 1965.
