For statistical purposes the industry titled Gypsum Products Manufacturers in the revised Standard Industrial Classification covers the operations of establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing plaster, plaster board and other products composed wholly or chiefly of gypsum.

Value of shipments and other revenue (manufacturing and non-manufacturing) of the Gypsum Products Manufacturers industry amounted to \$52.5 millions in 1967, compared with \$47.1 millions in 1966, an increase of \$5.4 millions or about 11.5 per cent. Included in this total were shipments of gypsum wallboard, gypsum lath and gypsum plasters valued at \$43.4 millions. Shipments of other manufactured products including secondary gypsum products amounted to \$2.9 millions, while other revenue (non-manufacturing) amounted to \$6.2 millions.

This industry's shipments of gypsum products, that is, gypsum wallboard, gypsum lath, gypsum plasters, etc. accounted for the bulk of its manufacturing revenue. Secondary products shipped by this industry in 1966 included mineral wool products, crude gypsum, concrete products, etc.

The cost of materials and supplies, etc. used in the production of goods of own manufacture increased by \$2.7 millions. Cost of materials and supplies etc. (inputs) in 1967 represented 42.2 per cent of value of shipments of own manufacture (outputs), compared with 40.0 per cent in 1966.

It should be noted that Table 8 covers the shipments of the establishments classified to this industry whereas Table 9 presents the total value of shipments of specific commodities of Canadian manufacture and includes (if applicable) shipments of those commodities reported by establishments classified to other industries.



- 2. Tables on principal statistics classified by manufacturing value added, by total value added, and by type of organization, published in the 1966 report as Tables 3, 4 and 6, respectively, have been omitted from this report because of their limited interest. They are available, however, from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division. In the case of an extensive request involving a large number of industries, it may be necessary to levy a charge.
- 3. Users interested in obtaining the value of production (manufacturing activity) can do so by adding cost of materials and supplies used (manufacturing activity), cost of fuel and electricity, and value added (manufacturing activity). The resulting statistic is equivalent in concept to "gross output" shown in Table 7 of the 1966 report.
