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INTRODUCTORY NOTE

This bulletin constitutes the initial presentation of the "new" Refined Petroleum Products report. The information in this report was developed from data supplied on a new form designed to replace the Refinery Report and the Wholesale Marketing Report forms which have been used up to this time. The "new" form is the result of discussions with representatives of the petroleum industry and was designed to enable the reporting companies to file a consolidated report covering all operations in the producing, refining and marketing of petroleum products. The consolidated report which is one of the features of the new procedure eliminates the need of filing separate reports for each refinery as was the custom under the old basis.

It is hoped that this new approach to collecting data on refined petroleum products will make it possible to eliminate serious discrepancies which were evident in some aspects of the previous presentation particularly as regards to "Domestic Consumption" figures. Import data which are an important consideration in developing the latter were obtained in part by circularizing all known importers. Maintaining the currency of such a list posed problems for the Bureau and as a result it was difficult to obtain complete coverage of all importations. In consequence, the serious discrepancies mentioned above were introduced. The new procedure utilizes Trade of Canada figures compiled by the External Trade Section of the Bureau and, therefore, reduces considerably the possibility of error from this direction.

The instruction sheet used in connection with the "new" survey is reproduced on the following pages to assist in the interpretation of the headings appearing in the tables.

INSTRUCTION SHEET

FOR THE NEW

MONTHLY REPORT ON REFINED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

(A) RAW MATERIALS SUPPLY

Crude Oil -

Production - Report gross company operated production of crude oil, credited to the provinces in which produced.

Purchases in Canada - Report purchases of crude oil from other Canadian companies, credited to the provinces in which purchased.

Imports - Report all crude oil received from sources outside Canada, credited to the provinces in which landed.

Inventories - Report all stocks of crude oil in Canada in the field, in pipe-line systems and in refineries.

Sales - Report all sales of crude oil to other Canadian companies, and separately all sales for export from Canada. "Pipe-line allowance" should be considered as a sale to pipe-lines.

Transfers - Report all movements of crude oil from original sources of supply to refineries located in another province.

Losses - Report all losses of crude oil between the point of production or of import and actual charging to refinery stills.

Natural Gas Liquids -

Production - Report field production of propane, butane, natural gasoline, etc.

Imports - Report only casinghead, natural gasoline, etc. Do not include imports of finished liquefied petroleum gases.

Other Materials Used - Include non-petroleum additives, such as lead, furnace fuel inhibitors, etc.

The total of crude oil consumed, natural gas liquids consumed, and other materials used - both domestic and imported - should equal the total of the first three columns of Section C, which refers to finished petroleum products.

(B) RECEIPTS OF CRUDE OIL

Report actual receipts at refineries. Give separate figures for each supplying country in the case of imports, and for each province and each major field in the case of Canadian crude.

(C) FINISHED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

Refinery production - Report, by product and by provinces, the production from crude and from other materials actually processed in the refineries.

Blending stocks - Report, by product and by provinces, the blending stocks and other ingredients actually used in current production.

Field plant L.P.G. not blended with other products at refineries should be included under Canadian blending stocks, either as L.P.G. or as petro-chemical feed stocks, depending on the use to which it is put.

Purchases in Canada - Report purchases of petroleum products from other refineries in Canada, also purchases from any other sources in Canada. Show separately the purchases from other reporting companies. See the separate list for the names of the reporting companies.

Imports - Report all finished or unfinished products received from sources outside Canada. Care should be taken to ensure that imports reported here agree with the customs entry statement for the month of purchase, the product category and the province of entry.

Inventories - Report all refinery and marketing inventories, corrected by any exchange balances, these balances to be added or deducted in the province where the exchange is to be repaid. Companies will consider balances owing them on exchange as part of their inventory. Conversely, balances due on exchange will not be included in inventory.

Net transfers will reflect the balance of interprovincial and inter-product movements, whether at the refinery or the marketing level.

Sales to reporting companies - See attached list for the names of reporting companies.

Exports - Report all products sold for delivery to points outside Canada.

Domestic demand will be arrived at by the addition and subtraction of all preceding columns, and represents the domestic disappearance of supplies.

(C) FINISHED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS (Concluded)

Losses - Report all refinery and marketing losses.

Own consumption - Report all amounts produced or purchased and used in own refineries, etc.

Sales will be arrived at by deducting losses and own consumption from the total compiled for domestic demand and should agree with the total sales actually experienced by the reporting company, other than sales for exports and to other reporting companies.

Unfinished products - Include products in process, semi-finished materials imported and retained in the refinery for further processing, such as catalytic feed stock, lube distillates, alkylate, etc. Under refinery production, the actual net consumption of unfinished products during the month will show as a minus quantity, while an accumulation of unfinished products will show as a plus quantity.

Lubrication oils and greases - Combine the figures for oils and greases, except in last column, which refers to net sales. Give estimated breakdown of sales if actual figures are not readily available from your records.

Kerosene and stove oil - Combine the figures for kerosene and stove oil, except in last column, which refers to net sales. Give estimated breakdown of sales if actual figures are not readily available from your records.

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REFINED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

MARCH - 1955

Output of refined petroleum products in Canada during March, 1955, totalled 14,588,549 barrels compared with 11,932,099 barrels in March, 1954. The total for the month under review included 5,781,244 barrels of motor gasoline, 42,877 barrels of aviation gasoline, 3,287,902 barrels of heavy fuel oil (Nos. 4, 5 and 6), 984,541 barrels of diesel fuel, 2,039,054 barrels of furnace oil, 147,743 barrels of other light fuel oil, 1,050,581 barrels of kerosene and stove oil (No. 1 fuel oil), 42,333 barrels of tractor fuel, 226,451 barrels of aviation turbine fuel, 73,954 barrels of naphtha specialties, and other refinery products such as lubricating oils, asphalt, coke, liquefied petroleum gases, etc.

Refineries in Canada used 14,348,224 barrels of crude oil during March, 1955, compared with 12,490,886 barrels in March, 1954. Receipts of crude oil during the current month totalled 14,175,094 barrels, including 6,905,072 barrels of imported oil and 7,270,022 barrels from Canadian sources of supply. Inventories of crude at the end of the month amounted to 18,021,389 barrels. This latter figure includes stocks held at the field, in pipeline systems and in refineries. Comparable figures on this basis are not available for 1954.

Net sales of liquid petroleum fuels in Canada, as computed from production, imports, exports, changes in inventories, etc., were as follows in March, 1955, all figures being in barrels of 35 Imperial gallons: Naphtha specialties, 89,501; aviation gasoline, 278,266; motor gasoline, 4,990,786; tractor fuel, 12,557; aviation turbine fuel, 208,760; kerosene, 53,849; stove oil (No. 1 fuel oil), 1,547,122; diesel fuel, 1,071,967; furnace oil, 4,579,371; other light fuel oil, 201,867; and heavy fuel oil (Nos. 4, 5 and 6), 2,953,495.

NOTE: It is the practice of the External Trade Section to close off their records for a particular month with entries received on the last working day; accordingly, there may be some carry over into the next month. That is to say, imports during the last few days of a month may be recorded in the totals for the following month. Figures shown in Table 3 have been adjusted by pulling back any carry over and Table 3, therefore, shows totals for the full month. For this reason the figures differ slightly from the figures shown in the above table.

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
