

Explanatory Notes re Gas Sales

Industrial customers include manufacturers, foundries, machine shops, wholesale bakeries, commercial laundries, etc.

Commercial customers include hotels, restaurants, retail bakers, delicatessens, tailor shops, department stores, wholesale dealers, professional and business offices, etc.

Sales figures represent sales by distributing companies to customers, as well as an estimate of gas used by industrial consumers who operate their own wells.

Miscellaneous sales include some free customers. The dollar values include some forfeited discounts, penalties, etc., and therefore bear no relationship to the quantities shown.

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
