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SALES OF MANUFACTURED AND NATURAL GAS

January, 1961

Natural gas sales in January increased 16.0 per cent to 42,151,913 Mcf.from 36,343,800 in January last year; revenue from sales increased 20.4 per cent to \$27,605,023 from \$22,918,982 and number of customers increased 7.1 per cent to 1,207,838 from 1,127,874.

Residential sales increased 13.9 per cent to 18,319,939 Mcf.and accounted for 43.5 per cent of all sales. Revenue from residential sales increased 18.9 per cent and accounted for 61.0 per cent of the total revenue. The total number of customers in this category increased 4,000 from December and 68,000 from last January.

Ontario residential sales, which accounted for 43.8 per cent of the Canadian volume and 56.5 per cent of the revenue, increased 24.9 per cent from last January. Alberta accounted for 29.1 per cent of the sales volume and 14.3 per cent of the revenue in this category but sales decreased by 4.4 per cent. Part of the increase in domestic sales in Ontario and Quebec was caused by colder weather than January 1960; however, in Western Canada, the weather was considerably warmer than in the previous year.

Industrial sales, which made up 37.6 per cent of the total volume and 19.8 per cent of the total revenue, increased 18.2 per cent to 15,860,806 Mcf. Alberta is the largest user of industrial gas, taking 44.9 per cent followed by Ontario, 29.7 per cent.

Commercial sales constituted 18.9 per cent of total sales and 19.1 per cent of the revenue. These sales increased 16.4 per cent to 7,955,073 Mcf.in January. Alberta had the largest share of the commercial sales, 45.6 per cent, followed by Ontario, 28.1 per cent.

This report for the first time includes three additional tables, 2, 3 and 6. Tables 2 and 6 show the receipts and disposition of gas by the natural and manufactured components respectively, while table 3 shows the receipts and disposition of natural gas in both the transmission and distribution systems, and consequently approximates a natural gas supply-demand table for all of Canada.

In January the distribution systems net receipts were 43,135,226 Mcf.natural gas of which 18,419,553 Mcf.was from its own gathering systems and 24,697,103 was from the gas pipe line transport industry. In addition, gas storage operations contributed 679,866 Mcf. The disposition of the receipts was mainly sales made to ultimate consumers and deliveries to storage amounted to almost 1 billion cubic feet.

Total net receipts of the transmission and distribution systems combined amounted to 56,030,-905 Mcf. while receipts from storage operations was 5,750,887 Mcf. In addition to the sales reported above, exports to the United States amounted to 15,022,737 Mcf. and deliveries to storage 937,788. Line pack increased 136,915 Mcf. while gas used was 1,119,860 Mcf. Gas unaccounted for at 1,039,138 made up only 1.8 per cent of the total net receipts.

Volumes of natural gas and liquefied petroleum gases in this report are given in thousands of cubic feet (Mcf.) of 1,000 British thermal units at 14.73 pounds per square inch absolute and at 60° F. Volumes of manufactured gas are given in thousands of cubic feet (Mcf.) of 500 British thermal units at 14.73 pounds per square inch absolute and at 60° F.
