SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

MARCH- 1946

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$4,680,798 in March 1946, compared with \$3,970,378 in February 1946. In March the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 52 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 35 per cent, water paints for 5 per cent and unclassified sales for 8 per cent.
