SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

MAY, 1946

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$5,922,712 in May, 1946. compared with \$5,484,554 in April, 1946. In April the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 49 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 37 per cent, water paints for 4 per cent and unclassified sales for 10 per cent.
