SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

JULY, 1946

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally recount for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$4,965,209 in July, 1946, compared with \$5,482,586 in June, 1946. In July the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 51 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 35 per cent, water paints for 3 per cent, and unclassified sales for 11 per cent.
