SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

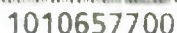
AUGUST, 1946

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$4,899,623 in August, 1946, compared with \$4,965,209 in July, 1946. In August the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 47 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 38 per cent, water paints for 4 per cent, and unclassified sales for 11 per cent.
