Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manfacturers, which nomally accounted for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, anounted to $\$ 4,753,071$ in Tonnnry, 1947, compared with $\$ 3,844,843$ in January, 1946. In Janusry, 1947 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 48 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 39 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent and unclassifled sales for 11 per cent.
