Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to $\$ 5,717,284$ in November 1947 compared with $\$ 6,352,43$ ? in October, 1947. In November, 1947 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accuunted for about 46 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 37 por cent, water paints for 3 per cent, and unclassified sales for 14 per cent.
